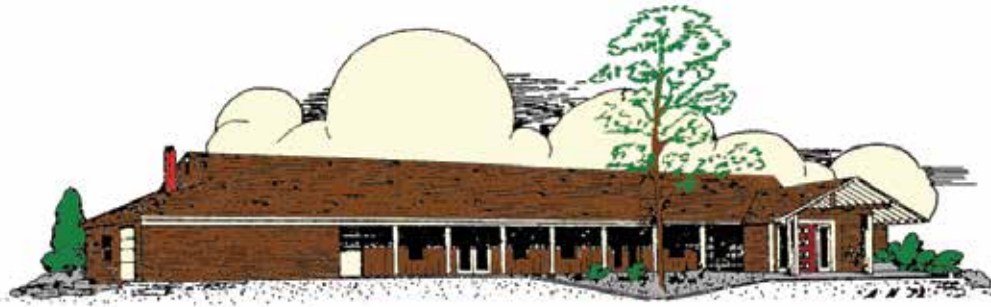

Fire Pits - What needs a permit and what doesn't?

Because we live in a forested area and to ensure everyone's safety, residents are asked to submit an Architectural Request Form for any fire pit to ensure safe use.

Propane fire pits and chiminea with a screen on the top of the chimney **do not** require permits.

Any other fire pit, either like the one pictured on top or a metal bowl type typically found at Home Depot or Lowes **do require a permit** from the State. These are considered "open burn". Permits are issued by the State Forest Fire Service, and we can supply you with the information.

Initial permits are issued for 30 days and, if in compliance, a 90-day permit will then be issued. The permit can be renewed every 90 days. Please provide the office with a copy of your permit.

The size of built fire pit cannot be more than 3 ft. x 3 ft. x 3 ft.

Only seasoned firewood can be burned. No tree branches or other "green wood", no pine needles or any other materials.

The pit must be 15 feet from a structure and be surrounded by 5 feet of clean mineral soil or rock.

Homeowner's Association Meeting

Date: October 3, 2024

Location: SRPE Clubhouse, 979 Edgebrook Drive N., Toms River, NJ 08757

Time: 6:30 pm – 27 residents in attendance; 8 residents on line

- I. **Call to Order:** President Phil Cupo called the meeting to order at 6:35pm
- II. **Guest Presentation on Part D Medicare:** Speaker from Ocean County Senior Services; Part D Medicare. Stacy outlined the Medicare Prescription plans and how they work alone and when combined with both Advantage and Supplemental plans. She said open registration for these plans runs from October 16th through December 7th. Trained volunteers from Senior Services will be at the SRPE clubhouse on November 12th for those who have signed up for a personalized discussion of available Part D Medicare plans. Homeowners may call Gail at 973-214-3664 to see if any appointment times remain. For those unable to schedule a meeting on November 12, Ocean County Senior Services offers this assistance at two locations locally, including County Connection at the Ocean County Mall and at the Ocean County Library, as well as at a third location in Manahawkin. Stacy urged those who have prescription coverage to check the prices of their prescriptions since they can change from year to year. For further information, call **732-929-2091**. Finally, the website Medicare.gov Plan Finder is available where you can check the cost of Part D plans.
- III. **Roll Call of Trustees:** Present: Trudy Venskus, Pete Szybel, Pat Tatulli, Susan Swain, James Clarke, Dave Fuhrman, Kathy Conte, Mary Conery, Mike Joffe. Absent: Debbie Moriarty.
- IV. **President's Announcements:** included notifying members that:
 - A. A vagrant has been observed behind homes on Edinburgh Drive and requesting those who notice him to call police as Trustees are limited in actions they can take to remove him.
 - B. The search for an Office Manager is continuing. Interested owners are encouraged to apply.
 - C. Trustees are seeking a third estimate for the Clubhouse storage area extension.
 - D. Beautification of the landscaping around the clubhouse is tabled until next fiscal year.
 - E. The Finance Committee is being formed to address budgeting for next fiscal year.
 - F. Trustees met with the engineering firm at the last agenda meeting to discuss phase I of the reserve study and are forming a committee to address all aspects of the study in preparation for Phase II.
 - G. The audit of last fiscal year ending on March 31, 2024 has been completed and a meeting will be held with the accountant at an agenda meeting to be announced.
 - H. The next HOA meeting will host Ms. Velus Campbell from Holisticare Hospice.
- V. **Approval of Meeting Minutes:** Motion to approve Minutes of the September 5th 2024 Homeowner's meeting made by James Clarke, seconded by Kathy Conte and approved unanimously.
- VI. **Approval of the Treasurer's report:** Treasurer Scott Stern reported that there are a few budget categories showing slightly higher than budgeted expenditures, but he expects them to even out over time. Motion to approve the Treasurer's report was made by Mary Conery, seconded by Kathy Conte and approved unanimously.
- VII. **New Business:**
 - A. **Administrative Report:**
 - A. **Real Estate:** 3 homes sold, 12 homes for sale.
 - B. **Delinquent Accounts and Vacant Properties:** Total liens on properties in SRPE amount to \$34,259.66 as of September 30, 2024; Total of liens and overdue dues and violations is \$42,614.51, half of which is attributable to fines. There are 13 vacant properties.
 - B. **Finance Committee report given by Scott Stern.** Scott announced that budget meetings will be held in the evenings with the first meeting tentatively scheduled for October 28th. Owners will be notified of time and location.
 - C. **Coalition Report given by Kathy Conte:**
 - A. Ocean County Library's Homebound and Volunteer Services is a new program offering books by mail, a home borrower's service and mobile library services. Those interested can apply for a library card on the Ocean County Library web site. Programs are available to train and support volunteers who provide these and other services to the community.

- B. Applications to take advantage of the Anchor program must be filed by the end of the month.
 - C. The Senior Freeze in New Jersey provides property tax assistance to owners who have lived in New Jersey for at least 10 years and in the same home for at least the last 5 years.
 - D. Ocean County homes will be scheduled to be reassessed in the near but indefinite future.
- D. Reserve Study:** The Engineering firm conducting the reserve study presented an assessment of common elements and a schedule of repair or replacement over the next 20 years. We were advised to increase assessments by \$5 per year to address financing of these items rather than keeping dues stable and requiring a special assessment when common elements are no longer functioning. Owners are encouraged to join the budget meeting where the monthly reserve contribution as well as operating expenses will be addressed.
- VIII. Continuing Business:**
- A. Goto Meeting:** Mike reported that after working with Kathy and Helen the remote meeting connection issues appear to have been solved and that eight owners are in attendance from home.
 - B. Sidewalk Repair:** Mike stated that an estimate has been received to repair the sidewalk at Chutney Street and the solution will be to grind down the existing concrete at a cost of \$600.
- IX. Motions:**
- A. Architectural Committee:** Motion to approve 16'x16' deck and a 10'x8' shed at 10 York Street; a pergola at 75 Edinburgh Drive; a correction to last months approval of a deck from 16 Concord Lane to 15 Concord Lane and to disapprove a 6'x8' shed that exceeds the sidelines of the house at 35 Edinburgh Drive was approved by Jim Clark and seconded by Dave Fuhrman.
 - B. Motion to approve an expenditure of \$600 to repair the sidewalk on Chutney Street was approved by Kathy Conte and seconded by Mary Conery.**
- X. Section Reports:** Sections 1 – 12 reported no issues other than the vagrant in Section 7.
- XI. Committee Reports:**
- A. Entertainment Committee:** Gail was pleased to report that she heard compliments from owners who attended the picnic and expressed her thanks to the grill masters and volunteers, and to homeowners who brought homemade dishes to share. She stated that the Health Fair will be in the Clubhouse on November 12th between 10am and 12:30. The Craft Fair and Bake Sale will be held on November 16th. She asked volunteers to join the committee on November 13th to decorate the clubhouse and set up tables for the Craft Fair. After the craft fair the Entertainment committee will be taking a break.
 - B. Common Grounds Committee:** Mike reported that the landscaping company has changed ownership for a third time to American Property Pros, but the crew has not changed. Insurance coverage and licensing documentation have been obtained. The Board has voted not to allow the workers to leave machinery in the parking lot overnight on days when they are working in the community. Owners are welcome to enhance common property behind their homes after submitting their plans to the architectural committee for approval.
 - C. Park Echo:** Gail announced that the deadline to post items in the November Park Echo is October 7th.
 - D. Sunshine Committee:** Elva reported that 4 Echos were mailed to former residents, one get well card and 2 sympathy cards. She thanked homeowners who call to let her know a card will be well received.
 - E. Hospitality:** Katherine said she would appreciate help with refreshments at the next HOA meeting.
- XII. Comments from the Membership:** A resident was again expressing concern that receipts of New Owner Fees are budgeted when their amounts are uncertain. He also inquired about where the Club and Committee money goes. He was advised these funds are accounted for separately from the budget and any excess is donated to the Association and charitable organizations. Another owner expressed concern about the deer and wondered whether there are programs underway to control the population. Trustees replied that they have addressed the subject of deer within and outside the community and that efforts made by Township and County authorities to control the population have been thwarted.

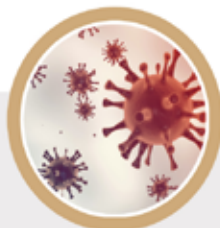

Some issues raised in our past survey are most appropriately resolved by Berkeley Township, not the SRPE Board of Trustees.

PLEASE NOTE: All reports/complaints to the Township are anonymous and will not be traced back to you.

ALSO, IMPORTANT TO NOTE: Do Not call 911 unless there is a 'real' emergency.

- **Speeding on our roads** – YOU CAN complain to the Chief of Police, Kevin Santucci @ 732-341-1132, a non-emergency number. A license plate number would be helpful.
- **Unregistered/uninsured cars** – YOU CAN contact the police and/or code enforcer @ 732-244-7400 x1237 who can ask the resident for their auto registration and proof of insurance, tickets can be issued.
- **Load Mufflers/Noise** – YOU CAN call Berkeley Township Police Officers who can check cars for illegal mufflers and excessive idling. It is very helpful to provide the location and time of day these incidents occur. This will further help the investigation.
- **Parking opposite traffic** – is illegal, YOU CAN call the BTPD to report @ 732-341-1132.
- **Feeding the Deer** –YOU CAN call Animal Control @ 732-797-1413, a summons and fine may be issued – a photo would back up your complaint.

SRPE Illegal Home Rentals

The Board has been informed repeatedly that some homeowners are renting their homes without notifying the Association – perhaps to avoid the \$300 fee, skirt age restrictions, or perhaps just plain ignorance.

This is a violation of our Covenants & Restrictions, which state that the Association must be notified before renting; the Tenant must be age 55 or older; and a home cannot be rented unless you have lived in it for one year as a primary residence.

It is also a violation of Berkeley Township ordinances requiring the owner/landlord to register with the Township, provide an age-approval letter from the Association, and pay a Certificate of Occupancy inspection fee, total amount of \$95 (2 separate checks made out to Berkeley Township: one for \$55 and the other for \$40).

Fees from house rentals help keep our dues from increasing and help keep your taxes down.

Most homeowners/landlords follow our C&R and Berkeley Township laws, but there are some who do not.

If you see someone moving into a house in our community, please call the office so we can verify that they have complied with these restrictions. The caller's name is always kept confidential.

PLEASE REPORT ANY CHANGES IN YOUR HOUSEHOLD

To keep information on our community current, please notify the Office if there are any changes in your household.

This is necessary for statistical / HOPA purposes.

Typical changes would include:

- A new or additional phone number
- A homeowner has deceased or moved from the residence
- A change in occupancy, such as someone moving into or out of the residence
- Deed changes

ATTENTION Delinquent Homeowners

To bring severely delinquent accounts up to date, and upon the advice of the SRPE Attorney, please note the following:

If you are in arrears 1 year or more in your dues payments, you must call the Administrative Secretary to make arrangements to bring your account up to date.

Failure to do so will result in a lien being placed on your property. Court costs and attorney fees will be added to the amount in arrears.

Ultimately you may face foreclosure proceedings on your home.

As of Sept 30th, a total of \$42,615 are due. Out of that total, 22 residents are in arrears (unpaid dues equaling \$8,355) and 8 Liens (\$34,260)

**Article 10, Section (u) of SRPE
Covenants & Restrictions states:**

No work of a noisy or obnoxious nature should be done on Sunday before 10AM and after 6PM. Weekdays and Saturdays no noise before 8AM and after 8PM except in case of severe emergency conditions approved by the Board of Trustees. Contractors of any kind (landscapers, roofers, etc.) are prohibited on Sundays.

Berkeley Township Ordinance 4-27.6 (b1):
Non-commercial or non-industrial power tools and landscaping and yard maintenance equipment shall not be operated between the hours of 8PM and 8AM.

YARD WASTE

It has been noticed that there are some owners and renters dragging their foliage and yard waste to the **Common Grounds**. Please note that Berkeley Sanitation **DOES NOT** pickup in these areas, including yard waste left on the curb in the common area.

**PLEASE BUNDLE OR BAG YOUR YARD
WASTE AND PLACE ON YOUR CURB ON
THE REGULAR GARBAGE DAY PICK-UP**

Volunteers cannot keep cleaning up these common areas where folks dump their waste. There are too many common areas to keep up.

BRUSH

Residents can place 4 feet tied bundles of brush at their curb on garbage day. Maximum weight of bundles is 35 pounds. Brush bundled properly will be picked up every week on garbage day.

LEAVES / PINE NEEDLES

Leaves and pine needles are collected April & May and November & December. They are to be placed in plastic bags. They should not be more than ¾ filled, must be left untied at the top and weigh no more than 50 pounds. Bags should be placed on the curb and left there. Check with Berkeley Township Sanitation for actual dates.

Recycling and Trash Cans

Please be courteous to your neighbors, put a lid on your cans, especially when wind and stormy weather are predicted.

Neighbors should not have to pick up your garbage.

No Knock Registry

Berkeley Township does allow door to door soliciting by permit only. They do, however, offer a "no knock" registry. Form 04-34-OAB Registration Form – "DO NOT KNOCK" can be found on Berkeley Township website:

<https://www.berkeleypark.org/search.php?q=no+knock>

Once a resident signs up for this the Town will send a sticker for their front door. A company is provided a list of all addresses on the registry when applying for the permit. If someone does come to their house despite the sticker, they can call the police non-emergency number and report it. The violator is then subject to a fine and possible license revocation. This does not apply to religious, governmental, or political entities. Without the sticker, residents have no recourse other than not answering their door.

The Town cannot enforce the Association's solicitation prohibition.

Planning to Sell or Rent?

Read This First!

If you are a homeowner who is planning to put your home up for sale or rent, or if your home is currently for sale or rent without a realtor, you must contact the SRPE Clubhouse office immediately.

There are procedures, required by the Association and by Berkeley Township, that must be followed before a Closing of a Contract of Sale or Lease can take place.

- **Selling:** Article 11, Section 4 of our *Covenants & Restrictions* states, in part, that the owner of the property must notify the Association of the intended sale.
- **Renting/Leasing:** Article 10, Section(c) of our *Covenants & Restrictions* states that the owner of the property must notify the Association, in writing, that the prospective tenant meets the qualifications of membership in the Association.
- Berkeley Township requires a **“Continued Certificate of Occupancy”** (CO). Call the Berkeley Township Code Enforcement Office at (732) 244-7400, ext. 237, for more information.

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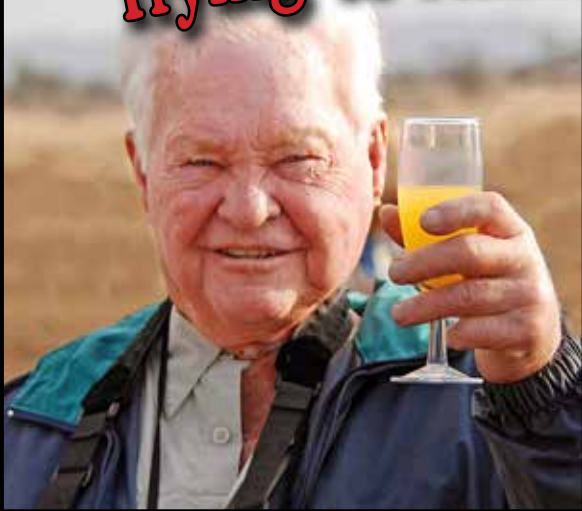
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
