

#### PLEASE BE AWARE ... SECURITY CONCERNS


It was brought to our attention recently that there have been a number of attempted break-ins during the weeks around the Christmas holidays. A resident was woken up by noises of someone trying to open a window in the back of her house. Her flood lights came on and scared that person away. Police were called in, unfortunately they were unable to find anything.

Another instance that happened in the same area, around the same time, with a home (Snow Bird) being ransacked and it looked like it may have been lived in by vandals. Again, Police were notified, and an investigation was carried out.

Please ... Please ... Please be aware of security in and around your home. A few tips on how to make your home and yourself safe:

- Flood lights or motion lights placed in dak areas not readily visible
- Motion detector cameras are useful to capture evidence of intruders
- Lock all doors, windows, and car doors, even if you are home to ensure safety
- Do not answer the door unless you know that person, or that person shows a valid ID

#### Silver Ridge Park Association, Inc. Homeowner's Association Meeting

Date: February 6, 2025

Location: SRPE Clubhouse, 979 Edgebrook Drive N., Toms River, NJ 08757 Time: 6:30 pm – 17 residents in attendance.

- I. Call to Order: President Phil Cupo called the meeting to order at 6:40pm
- II. Guest Presentation: Caitlin Hensley from Flagstar Bank summarized the many scams through email and phone calls meant to fool people into giving them money. She also pointed out some of the security measures banks have available to help account holders protect their accounts.
- **III. Roll Call of Trustees:** Present: Pat Tatulli, Pete Sztybel, Susan Swain, James Clarke, Dave Fuhrman, Kathy Conte and Debbie Moriarty, Mike Joffe and Mary Conery.
- IV. President's Announcements: included notifying members that:
  - A. The Ocean County Health Department will not continue their health visits due to lack of attendance.
  - **B.** 168 budget ballots were returned as of the deadline date of January 31<sup>st</sup>. There were 118 votes to pass the new budget with a \$10 increase, with 50 votes against. As of April 1, 2025, the dues will be \$100 per quarter.
  - C. Ballots to elect a new President and Board of Trustees will be mailed out on February 12<sup>th</sup>. Please use this opportunity to vote for any of the candidates you feel will best represent you. A space will be provided for you to add your vote for yourself or someone whose name is not already listed. Please follow the instructions provided with the ballots carefully. Ballots must be sealed in the ballot envelope and placed in the return envelope provided. The return envelope can either be mailed or placed in the ballot box or the office mail slot.
  - **D.** Our Meet the Candidates" gathering will be held on February 19<sup>th</sup> at 7pm. You are encouraged to join us and get to know this year's candidates for President and Board of Trustees. Debbie will be providing more information about this gathering and the election later in the meeting.
  - **E.** On Thursday, March 6, we will be holding the Annual Meeting of the HOA. At the meeting, ballots will be counted and members of your new Board of Trustees announced to the membership.
- V. Approval of Meeting Minutes: Motion to approve Minutes of the January 2, 2025 Homeowner's meeting was made by Jim Clarke, seconded by Kathy Conte and approved unanimously.
- VI. Approval of the Treasurer's report: Scott reported that there is a minor error in the earlier financial statements. The error was corrected in the January statement. Otherwise everything is moving along as we expected. Motion was made to approve the Treasurer's report by Scott Stern, seconded by Kathy Conte and approved unanimously.
- VII. New Business:

#### A. Administrative Report:

- 1. Real Estate: Mary reported 47 homes sold over the course of the calendar year. 3 homes were sold in January, 6 homes are currently for sale and there are 5 active flippers.
- 2. Delinquent Accounts and Vacant Properties: 46 owners did not pay their third quarter dues, totaling \$4,900. Unpaid violations balance is \$15,065. There are 7 active liens and 2 foreclosures in progress.
- 3. Volunteer hours: Total volunteer hours for the last calendar year, 389 hours, valued at \$6,031.

#### B. Coalition Report

- 1. The coalition requests that homeowners refrain from feeding the deer. It is reported that the township is becoming more aggressive with fining for this violation of township statutes.
- 2. Forms for the New Jersey Stay, Anchor and Senior Freeze applications will be included on a single form this year to be mailed out toward the end of February. The form will also be on the NJ state website. There has been some confusion concerning how these rebates will be distributed. There will be a meeting at the coalition next month where representatives from the State Treasury will clarify how these rebates will work.
- **3.** A solar field has been erected in Berkeley Township. Owners interested in saving money on their electric bills by buying into the solar field are advised to go to the "Thinkenergy.com/Berkeley" web site.

#### VIII. Continuing business

A. Pending Elections: Debbie reported that ballots to elect a new Board of Trustees will be mailed out next week (February 12). Currently we have three (3) candidates and a total of seven (7) open positions. You are asked to select a candidate and/or write in any name that does not already appear on the ballot, including your own. Ballots are due back in the office on March 5 by 11am. The Meet the Candidates event will be held on February 19<sup>th</sup> at 7pm in response to requests by homeowners

- that they have the opportunity to meet with the candidates before completing and returning their ballots. Additional volunteers are needed to count votes on election night, March 6. Please contact Debbie if you are available.
- B. Progress on the Reserve Study: Scott reported that the Reserve committee met and reviewed the numbers on the Reserve Study. He said the Engineers who prepared the study indicated that a very large sum of money is needed over the next three years for items which in their estimation had reached the end of their useful lives. It was decided that members of the committee gather their own estimates for the most expensive items on the list, one of which was to resurface the parking lot. The Engineers quote for this project was \$238,000, but the Committee was successful in obtaining a quote for around \$90,000. It was the opinion of the Committee that this expenditure would extend the useful life of the parking lot by 10 to 20 years. This would alleviate some of the pressure to meet the immediate financial burden presented by the other expensive items on the study that have reached the end of their useful lives.

#### IX. Motions:

A. Architectural approval: Kathy made a motion to approve a shed at 32 Hamilton Court. Motion was approved by Pat Tatulli, seconded by Debbie Moriarty and approved unanimously.

#### X. **Section Reports:**

- A. Section 10 reported two homes with violations which are being addressed.
- B. Section 12: Debbie reported there is a home with an infant in residence, which is being addressed.

#### XI. **Committee Reports:**

- A. Beautification: Debbie stated that the committee will reconvene in the spring.
- B. Grounds: Mike reported that the driveway was salted after the last snowfall.
- C. Entertainment & Flea Market: Gail reported that no events are scheduled until April, when there will be an Appreciation Night for homeowners, compliments of the Entertainment Committee. Space will be limited, so owners are asked to watch for listed dates when tickets will be available. The next Flea Market event will be the Junk in the Trunk, which will be held on May 4.
- D. House Committee: Debbie reported that the furnace required a small repair. She said the Committee is considering colors for painting the lobby area. Samples have been taped to the wall for comparison. She added later that the exit signs in the clubhouse were replaced on advice of the fire inspectors.
- E. Hospitality Committee: Katherine reported that everything is fine and thanked those who contributed snacks.
- F. Park Echo: Gail reported that she met with the Committee the other day and they were trying to come up with some ideas for the newsletter cover. She said they are running out of images that do not require a license. As a result, they are asking homeowners to submit art work or photographs to be considered as covers for future issues. It is requested that images are not of animals or people, and are seasonal.
- G. Pins and Needles: Joy reported that the committee meets every Tuesday from 1 to 3 in the library.
- H. Sunshine Committee: Elva reported that 6 Echos were mailed to former residents, 4 get well cards, 1 milestone 100th birthday card, and 1 sympathy card. She thanked homeowners in advance for their
- Trees: Pat reported that he is sharing the tree responsibilities with Janine Montefusco who is on vacation. He said he had one tree limb issue and three more on deck which he will take care of when the weather warms up. He said Janine's email and his telephone number are in the echo if owners need tree issues taken care of.
- J. Welcome Committee: Penny reported that 3 new owners were given welcome packets this month. She said this is the time of year when she gathers printed information from townships and county agencies and she is asking for ideas or suggestions to help with collecting this information which is sometimes not readily available. She said clubs and committees are welcome to contribute to the welcome packets. Currently one of the committee contributions is a "Golden Ticket" to attend one of the community events for free and another contributes a knitted or crocheted washcloth or pot holder. She invited other committees and clubs to contribute items to the welcome packets.
- XII. Comments from the Membership: Gail reported that the Knights of Columbus are holding an event in the clubhouse on February 13 and all proceeds will be donated to help with the California fires. Information is on the bulletin board. The cost to attend is \$15. Pete mentioned that the library is holding CPR courses.
- XIII. Next Meetings: Next HOA meeting will be held on Thursday, March 6th 2025 at 7:00 PM; The next agenda meeting is scheduled for February 20, 2025 at 10AM.
- XIV. **Adjournment:** The meeting was adjourned at 7:55 by Phil Cupo.



PLEASE NOTE: All reports/complaints to the Township are anonymous and will not be traced back to you.

#### ALSO, IMPORTANT TO NOTE: <u>Do Not</u> call 911 unless there is a 'real' emergency.

- Speeding on our roads YOU CAN complain to the Chief of Police, Kevin Santucci @ 732-341-1132, a non-emergency number. A license plate number would be helpful.
- Unregistered/uninsured cars YOU CAN contact the police and/or code enforcer @ 732-244-7400 x1237 who can ask the resident for their auto registration and proof of insurance, tickets can be issued.
- Loud Mufflers/Noise YOU CAN call Berkeley Township Police Officers who can check cars for illegal
  mufflers and excessive idling. It is very helpful to provide the location and time of day these incidents
  occur. This will further help the investigation.
- Parking opposite traffic is illegal, YOU CAN call the BTPD to report @ 732-341-1132.
- Feeding the Deer –YOU CAN call Animal Control @ 732-797-1413, a summons and fine may be issued – a photo would back up your complaint.

#### **SRPE Association Announcements**

#### >> Please adhere to the following Ordinance, SRPE Covenants & Restrictions <<

#### Berkeley Township Ordinance 4-27.6 (b1):

Non-commercial or non-industrial power tools and landscaping and yard maintenance equipment <u>shall not be operated</u> between the hours of 8PM and 8AM.

#### Article 10, Section (u) of SRPE Covenants & Restrictions states:

No work of a noisy or obnoxious nature should be done on Sunday before 10AM and after 6PM. Weekdays and Saturdays no noise before 8AM and after 8PM except in case of severe emergency conditions approved by the Board of Trustees. Contractors of any kind (landscapers, roofers, etc.) are prohibited on Sundays.

#### SRPE Illegal Home Rentals

The Board has been informed repeatedly that some homeowners are renting their homes without notifying the Association – perhaps to avoid the \$300 fee, avoid age restrictions, or perhaps just plain unawareness.

This is a violation of our Covenants & Restrictions, which state that the Association must be notified before renting; the Tenant must be aged 55 or older; and a home cannot be rented unless you have lived in it for two years as a primary residence.

It is also a violation of Berkeley Township ordinances requiring the owner/landlord to register with the Township, provide an age-approval letter from the Association, and pay a Certificate of Occupancy (COO) inspection fee, total amount of \$95 (2 separate checks made out to Berkeley Township: one for \$55 and the other for \$40).

Fees from house rentals help keep our dues from increasing and help keep your taxes down.

Most homeowners/landlords follow our C&R and Berkeley Township laws, but there are some who do not.

If you see someone moving into a house in our community, please call the office so we can verify that they have complied with these restrictions. The caller's name is always kept confidential.

#### PLEASE REPORT ANY CHANGES IN YOUR HOUSEHOLD

To keep information on our community current, please notify the Office if there are any changes in your household.

This is necessary for statistical HOPA purposes.

#### Typical changes would include:

- A new or additional phone number
- A homeowner has deceased or moved from the residence
- A change in occupancy, such as someone moving into or out of the residence
- Deed changes

#### **ATTENTION Delinquent Homeowners**

To bring severely delinquent accounts up to date, and upon the advice of the SRPE Attorney, please note the following:

If you are in arrears 1 year or more in your dues payments, you must call the Administrative Secretary to make arrangements to bring your account up to date.

Failure to do so will result in a Lien being placed on your property. Court costs and attorney fees will be added to the amount in arrears. Ultimately you may face foreclosure proceedings on your home.

As of January 31<sup>st</sup>, a total of \$ 36,044.46 are due. Out of that total: \$4,140.00 (46 residents are in arrears, unpaid dues); \$30,765.46 (7 Liens); and \$1,139.00 (short payments, late fees, lien discharge, processing fee). Contact the office during business hours if you want more information.

#### Garbage & Recycling Pick-Ups

PLEASE Help Keep Our Community Clean!!!

#### Planning to Sell or Rent? Read This First!

If you are a homeowner who is planning to put your home up for sale or rent, or if your home is currently for sale or rent without a realtor, you must contact the SRPE office immediately.

There are procedures, required by the Association and by Berkeley Township, that must be followed before a Closing of a Contract of Sale or Lease can take place.

- Selling: Article 11, Section 4 of our Covenants & Restrictions states, in part, that the owner of the property must notify the Association of the intended sale.
- Renting/Leasing: Article 10, Section(c) of our Covenants & Restrictions states that the owner of the property must notify the Association, in writing, that the prospective tenant meets the qualifications of membership in the Association.
- Berkeley Township requires a "Continued Certificate of Occupancy" (CO). Call the Berkeley Township Code Enforcement Office at (732) 244-7400, ext. 237, for more information.
