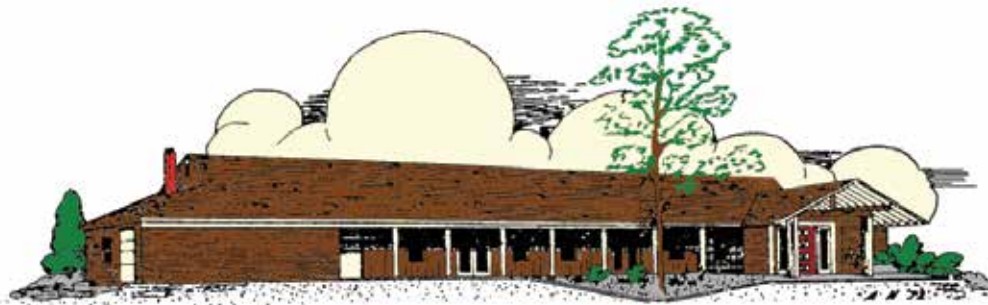

Fire Pits - What needs a permit and what doesn't?

Because we live in a forested area and to ensure everyone's safety, residents are asked to submit an Architectural Request Form for any fire pit to ensure safe use.

Propane fire pits and chiminea with a screen on the top of the chimney *do not* require permits.

Any other fire pit or a metal bowl type typically found at Home Depot or Lowes *do require* a permit from the State. These are considered "open burn". Permits are issued by the State Forest Fire Service, and we can supply you with the information.

Initial permits are issued for 30 days and, if in compliance, a 90-day permit will then be issued. The permit can be renewed every 90 days. Please provide the office with a copy of your permit.

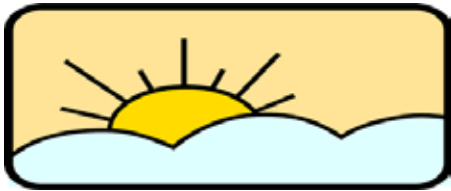
The size of the built fire pit cannot be more than 3 ft. x 3 ft. x 3 ft.

Only seasoned firewood can be burned. No tree branches or other "green wood", no pine needles or any other materials.

The pit must be 15 feet from a structure and be surrounded by 5 feet of clean mineral soil or rock.

Homeowner's Association Meeting**

Date: April 3, 2025

Location: SRPE Clubhouse, 979 Edgebrook Drive N., Toms River, NJ 08757

Time: 7:00 pm – 25 residents in attendance.

- I. **Call to Order:** President Phil Cupo called the meeting to order at 7:15pm
- II. **Swearing in of the new Trustee:** President Phil Cupo swore in the new Trustee, Darlene DeGennaro.
- III. **Guest Speaker:** Phil introduced Yvette Atkins from Caregiver Volunteers of Central Jersey who discussed services offered by her organization for elderly individuals 60 and over who no longer drive as well as several other related services for the elderly and their caregivers.
- IV. **Roll Call of Trustees:** Present: Darlene DeGennaro, Pat Tatulli, Pete Szybel, Susan Swain, James Clarke, Dave Fuhrman, Kathy Conte, Debbie Moriarty. Eight of eight Trustees present comprising a quorum.
- V. **President's Announcements:**
 - A. Phil thanked the two departing Trustees, Mike Joffe and Mary Conery, for their hard work.
 - B. The reorganizational meeting of the Trustees was called on March 20th.
 1. Sections were assigned and the remaining Trustees for 2025 – 2026 decided to continue representing their sections. Darlene elected to represent Section 1.
 2. Trustees elected the officers of the Board.
 3. Committee chairpersons and members were appointed or volunteered.
 4. Board administrative and policy issues were discussed and settled or tabled for future consideration during the year.
 5. Reserve study issues and discussion points and a strategy for moving forward were addressed.
 - C. The Ocean County Document Shredding Program was announced and will take place in Berkeley at 630 Pinewald Keswick Avenue on April 26th from 9am until noon.
- VI. **Suggestions:** Kathy Conte read the two suggestions emailed to the office by residents. One was inquiring why there was no way to provide verification of occupancy on the web site. Kathy stated that she did not see a reason to provide that information on the web site. The second stated that dues increases should be increased at the same rate as social security increases.
- VII. **Approval of Meeting Minutes:** Motion to approve Minutes of the March 6, 2025 Homeowner's meeting was made by Jim Clarke, seconded by Dave Fuhrman and approved unanimously.
- VIII. **Approval of the Treasurer's report:** Treasurer Scott Stern announced that the end of the fiscal year 2024-2025 ended with a small surplus. He stated that he hoped additional expenditures on trees did not impact that surplus. Motion was made to approve the Treasurer's report by Kathy Conte, seconded by Debbie Moriarty and approved unanimously.
- IX. **New Business:**
 - A. **Administrative Report:**
 1. **Real Estate:** Kathy reported 2 homes closed in March, 6 homes currently for sale, no new tenants and no new Flippers.
 2. **Delinquent Accounts and Vacant Properties:** 15 owners did not pay their fourth quarter dues. Currently there are 4 active liens and 2 foreclosures in progress. Liens total \$35,273.17.
 - B. **Coalition Report:**
 1. Debbie stated that the coalition meeting was held this morning and it was announced that owners should complete their PAS-1 forms by October to invoke direct deposit for the three senior property tax relief refunds.
 2. The Ocean County Senior Services mobile unit will be visiting various locations to be announced. Information about various county programs and assistance completing forms will be offered. Dates to be announced.
 3. The Veteran's Village ground breaking will be held on May 7th at 11am. This residence for homeless vets is the first of its kind in New Jersey.
 4. Residents are permitted to bring up to 5 cases to be shredded at Ocean County Shredding Program locations. Debbie mentioned that Quinn Hopping is also doing shredding.
 5. Discussions continued on the Berkeley County solar field. Debbie encouraged those interested to see her for a copy of the flyer concerning the program.
- X. **Continuing business**
 - A. **Progress on the Reserve Study:** Scott reported that the committee is in the process of obtaining real world quotes for some of the items on the Reserve Study to compare with costs quoted in the study. He said the committee hopes to complete this phase of the Reserve Study Process in the next month.
- XI. **Motions:**

- A. **Election of Officers:** Phil made a motion to ratify the election of officers of the Board of Trustees for the year 2025 – 2026: For Vice President, Oliver Oramas; for Treasurer, Scott Stern; for Recording Secretary, Dru Sangemino; and for Administrative Secretary, Helen Griffin. Motion was approved by Debbie Moriarty, seconded by Jim Clarke and unanimously approved.
- B. **Architectural Committee approvals:** Kathy reported that the Architectural Committee approved a fire pit at 1087 Edgebrook Drive, a deck at 26 Sutherland; a shed at 18 Cambridge and solar panels at 34 Sutherland. Architectural committee report was approved by Debbie Moriarty, seconded by Dave Fuhrman and approved unanimously.

XII. Section Reports:

- A. Section 1 Darlene reported that she will be surveying her section; Section 2, Pat reported that he had to help a resident who had fallen from his bicycle and cautioned other residents to be careful when riding a bike in the neighborhood. Section 4: Pete reported there were some complaints about dog waste that he took care of. Section 5: Susan reported that one of her residents noticed baby foxes that had fallen ill in her back yard and called Animal Control. When response was not immediate, the resident called Susan. Susan contacted Frank at Animal Control who sent a vet to the woman's home that day to pick up the foxes and bring them to their facility in Monmouth County to recover. Section 12: Debbie reported that one of the homes in her section has about 20 bags of yard waste piled in front which she is addressing with the homeowner.

XIII. Committee Reports:

- A. **Beautification Committee:** Debbie reported that the committee met and discussed cementing over the partitions in the parking lot. She said they also discussed replacing the aging bushes and tree in front of the clubhouse.
- B. **Common Grounds.** Pat reported that he and two other residents went around the community cleaning up debris in the common areas. He stated that he received thank you's as well as complaints from homeowners in response to their work. He reminded those present that with few volunteers to assist there is a limit to how much clean-up can be accomplished.
- C. **Entertainment, Flea Market and Park Echo:**
 - 1. Tickets for the Community Day event are on sale tonight after the HOA meeting. Gail reported that 72 residents have already bought tickets. The event will be catered by Luigi's and DJ Billy will be the entertainment. Tickets for the Hawaiian Luau are also on sale tonight at \$40 PP. The Luau will be held on June 7th from 2pm to 6pm.

SRPE Association Announcements

>> **Please adhere to the following Ordinance, SRPE Covenants & Restrictions** <<

Berkeley Township Ordinance 4-27.6 (b1):

Non-commercial or non-industrial power tools and landscaping and yard maintenance equipment shall not be operated between the hours of 8PM and 8AM.

Article 10, Section (u) of SRPE Covenants & Restrictions states:

No work of a noisy or obnoxious nature should be done on Sunday before 10AM and after 6PM. Weekdays and Saturdays no noise before 8AM and after 8PM except in case of severe emergency conditions approved by the Board of Trustees. Contractors of any kind (landscapers, roofers, etc.) are prohibited on Sundays.

SRPE Illegal Home Rentals

The Board has been informed repeatedly that some homeowners are renting their homes without notifying the Association – perhaps to avoid the \$300 fee, avoid age restrictions, or perhaps just plain unawareness.

This is a violation of our Covenants & Restrictions, which state that the Association must be notified before renting; the Tenant must be aged 55 or older; and a home cannot be rented unless you have lived in it for two years as a primary residence.

It is also a violation of Berkeley Township ordinances requiring the owner/landlord to register with the Township, provide an age-approval letter from the Association, and pay a Certificate of Occupancy (COO) inspection fee, total amount of \$95 (2 separate checks made out to Berkeley Township: one for \$55 and the other for \$40).

Fees from house rentals help keep our dues from increasing and help keep your taxes down.

Most homeowners/landlords follow our C&R and Berkeley Township laws, but there are some who do not.

If you see someone moving into a house in our community, please call the office so we can verify that they have complied with these restrictions. The caller's name is always kept confidential.

PLEASE REPORT ANY CHANGES IN YOUR HOUSEHOLD

To keep information on our community current, please notify the Office if there are any changes in your household.

This is necessary for statistical HOPA purposes.

Typical changes would include:

- A new or additional phone number
- A homeowner has deceased or moved from the residence
- A change in occupancy, such as someone moving into or out of the residence
- Deed changes

ATTENTION Delinquent Homeowners

To bring severely delinquent accounts up to date, and upon the advice of the SRPE Attorney, please note the following:

If you are in arrears 1 year or more in your dues payments, you must call the Administrative Secretary to make arrangements to bring your account up to date.

Failure to do so will result in a Lien being placed on your property. Court costs and attorney fees will be added to the amount in arrears. Ultimately you may face foreclosure proceedings on your home.

As of March 31, a total of \$37,707.17 are due. Out of that total: \$35,273.17 (5 Liens); \$1,350.00 (15 residents which includes lien accts, are in arrears and unpaid dues); and \$1,084.00 (short payments, late fees, lien discharge and processing fee).

Garbage & Recycling Pick-Ups

PLEASE Help Keep Our Community Clean!!!

Garbage/Trash, items you wish to dispose of, and **Recycling** are **NOT** to be placed outside the front of your home, or on curb side, until after **4PM** the day before their designated pickup days.

Please keep a lid on it; neighbors should not have to pick up your trash during and after windstorms.

These are Berkeley Township ordinances which SRPE follows.

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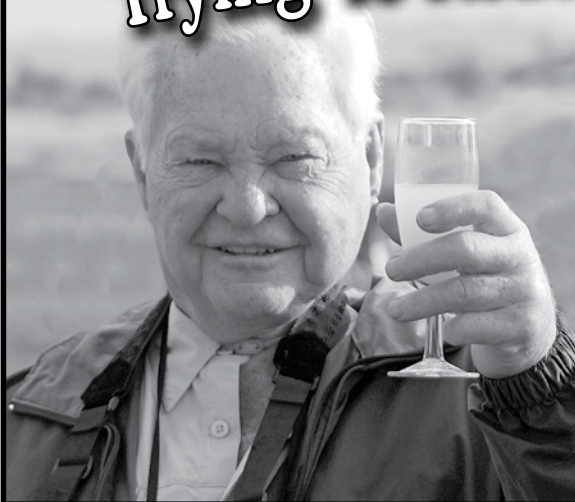

They accept trip reservations on a first-come, first served basis, up to (4) four weeks in advance. Pick-Up and Drop-Off Times: 9:15 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. (Last pick-up)

Trip requests are not accepted via email. All trip requests are to be handled by telephone by calling (732) 736-8989, then press "1" to speak with a Reservationist.

The Reserve-A-Ride program is primarily designed to serve routine medical needs of Ocean County residents. Unlike the Fixed Bus Routes, this service does not operate on the basis of a printed schedule, rather routes and pick-up times are developed each day in response to the service requests we receive. All vehicles are wheelchair lift equipped.

Once your reservation has been made, the driver will arrive anytime within 1 hour to 1½ hours of the scheduled appointment time (depending on your travel distance). In accordance with Ocean Ride's Safety Policy, our **Drivers are not permitted to enter your home**, thus we require that you be at ground level for your scheduled pick up.

Riders will be billed via mail, the month AFTER service. Absolutely NO CASH HANDLING on-board the Reserve-A-Ride vehicles.

HOPA FORM

HOPA stands for Housing for Older Persons Act, signed into law on December 28, 1995, by President Clinton. HOPA is intended and operated for occupancy by at least one person 55 years of age or older per unit. It is required that this information be collected and verified with the age of all residents, periodically (every two (2) years).

It is a Federal requirement for Senior Communities to have documentation on file.
Under NJ Law, a letter regarding age is required to be filed with the deed.

This MANDATORY form must be completed and returned to the Association Office no later than May 31, 2025. If the form is not in the Office on or before the deadline (May 31, 2025), a fine of \$25 will be imposed. Each additional month not received will incur an additional \$25 until the form is received and accepted by the office.

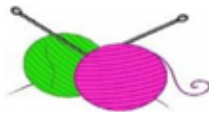

Planning to Sell or Rent?

Read This First!

If you are a homeowner who is planning to put your home up for sale or rent, or if your home is currently for sale or rent without a realtor, you must contact the SRPE office immediately.

There are procedures, required by the Association and by Berkeley Township, that must be followed before a Closing of a Contract of Sale or Lease can take place.

- **Selling:** Article 11, Section 4 of our *Covenants & Restrictions* states, in part, that the owner of the property must notify the Association of the intended sale.
- **Renting/Leasing:** Article 10, Section(c) of our *Covenants & Restrictions* states that the owner of the property must notify the Association, in writing, that the prospective tenant meets the qualifications of membership in the Association.
- Berkeley Township requires a **“Continued Certificate of Occupancy”** (CO). Call the Berkeley Township Code Enforcement Office at (732) 244-7400, ext. 237, for more information.
