

Silver Ridge Park Association, Inc. Homeowner's Association Meeting

Date: August 7, 2025

Location: SRPE Clubhouse, 979 Edgebrook Drive N., Toms River, NJ 08757 Time: 7:00 pm – 32 residents in attendance.

- Call to Order: President Phil Cupo called the meeting to order at 7:03pm
- II. Swearing in of new Trustee: Phil administered the oath of office to Mary Fiore.
- Guest Speaker: Phil introduced Mayor John Bacchione. The III. mayor was accompanied by Shawn Thomas, Director of Public Works: Councilman Mike Signorelli, and Vanerssa Borio, the Mayor's administrative assistant. The Mayor explained the reasons for implementing the change to robo-cans, mostly related to workmen's compensation and related cost savings. He then introduced Shawn Thomas who explained that old trash receptacles will be picked up over the next few days. In response to questions raised by the audience, he stated that all cardboard must be flattened. Any items that do not fit in receptacles require residents to either call to request pick-up or deliver them to the recycling center. Leaves and yard debris will be picked up according to the schedule detailed on the Public Works website. Call the Public Works office for more information



- **IV. Roll Call of Trustees:** Present: Darlene DeGennaro, Susan Swain, James Clarke, Kathy Conte, Dave Fuhrman, and Debbie Moriarty.
- V. Pledge of Allegiance
- VI. President's Announcements:
 - A. Phil announced that the Board has decided to resurface the parking lot and a motion to do so will be presented later in the meeting
 - B. The Board is continuing to discuss replacing the Bocce courts. No decision has been reached.
- VII. Approval of Meeting Minutes: Motion to approve Minutes of the June 5, 2025 Homeowner's meeting was made by James Clarke, seconded by Susan Swain and passed unanimously.
- VIII. Approval of the Treasurer's report: Treasurer Scott Stern announced that the budget continues to show a surplus, partly caused by decreased tree activity and the posting schedule for insurance payments. Otherwise there is nothing out of the ordinary. Motion to approve the Treasurer's report by Susan Swain and seconded by Jim Clarke was passed unanimously.
- IX. New Business:
 - A. Administrative Report:
 - 1. Real Estate: Kathy reported 2 rentals, 6 sales, 1 under contract and 5 homes for sale
 - 2. Delinquent Accounts: 54 owners did not pay their first quarter dues and \$375 in late fees were paid; Currently a foreclosure is in place for Cambridge Court for \$16,271.94. Liens are in place as follows: two homes on Edgebrook Drive North for \$795 and \$3,207.50, one on Chamberlain Drive for \$4,761.51, and one on Chancellor Ct. for \$13,918.04. Liens and foreclosures total \$38,953.99
 - B. Coalition Report:

Debbie reported that there was no coalition meeting this month.

- X. Continuing business
 - A. Progress on Owner access to Enumerate: Scott announced that owner access to their accounts is scheduled to be rolled out in approximately two weeks. He stated that any owner whose email address is on record will receive an email from Enumerate and requested that owners whose addresses are not on file but who wish access to their accounts contact the office.
- XI Motions:
 - A. Architectural Committee approvals: Kathy made a motion to approve 8 pre-sale home inspections passed by the committee as follows: 24 Hamilton Ct., 1086 Edgebrook Dr So., 15 Brian Ct.; 3 York St.; 30 Sherwood Lane; 14 Woodbury Ct,; 927 Edgebrook Dr No.; and 109 Edinburgh Ct.; Architectural inspections passed for a pergola at 23 Norwich, a fence at 2 Concord Lane and a deck at 30 Brian Ct. and final inspections at 30 Brian Ct. for a shed, 58 Edinburgh for solar panels and 27 Sutherland for a deck and porch railing. Motion was seconded by Debbie and passed unanimously.
 - **B.** Phil made a motion to approve resurfacing the parking lot for \$11,000 to \$19,000 to be funded by the reserves. Motion was seconded by Debbie and passed unanimously.

XII. **Section Reports:**

Section 7 reported she had 2 calls about the robo-cans and one call pertaining to trees. No other section issues were reported.

XIII. **Committee Reports:**

Before continuing with Committee Reports, Phil asked Darlene to announce formation of a new workshop. Darlene, a Licensed Clinical Social Worker, outlined her plans to lead a workshop called "The Many Experiences of Loss and Grief". She has scheduled the first meeting for Thursday, September 4th, and plans to meet from 1:00 to 2:30 every other week for 6 weeks. She said the group is meant to help people find their own ways to cope effectively with loss.

- A. Beautification Committee: Debbie stated there was nothing further to report.
- B. Common Grounds: Dave announced that the Common Grounds and Tree Committees have been merged. He reminded residents that the Association is responsible for trees only if they are on common ground and are diseased, dangerous or dead. He asked that anyone who notices a tree in this condition on common ground to complete and sign the form provided in the Park Echo or in the office.
- C. Entertainment, Flea Market and Park Echo:
 - 1. Phil thanked Gail and all the volunteers who helped set up for the picnic, Dave who did the cooking, all those who brought dishes to share and everyone for participating in the event. Gail then again thanked those who brought dishes and said there was a great deal of food enjoyed by all. She thanked all the committee members by name and the homeowners who helped to set up for the event and contributed additional food. She asked anyone who took pictures to forward them to her.
 - 2. Gail announced that the next Flea Market and Bake Sale will be held on Saturday, August 23rd from 9:00am to 2:00pm. At this time there are only 11 vendors, and she hopes to receive more requests to participate. Hot dogs and drinks will be available for sale, and everyone is invited to attend.
 - 3. Gail said she has received word that the Boy Scouts are interested in helping to set up tables and chairs for community events and plans to reach out to scout leaders today to assist with setting up for the Flea Market. The boys are between the ages of 11 and 18 years of age and do a lot for the senior communities.
 - 4. Echo deadline for September is August 8th. Residents are asked to continue sending photos or drawings for the cover as the supply of them is down to one.
- **D.** Hospitality Committee: Linda reported that refreshments are available.


Presentations at HOA Meetings

SRPE Association Announcements

>> Please adhere to the following Ordinance, SRPE Covenants & Restrictions << Berkeley Township Ordinance 4-27.6 (b1):

Non-commercial or non-industrial power tools and landscaping and yard maintenance equipment <u>shall not be operated</u> between the hours of 8PM and 8AM.

Article 10, Section (u) of SRPE Covenants & Restrictions states:

No work of a noisy or obnoxious nature should be done on Sunday before 10AM and after 6PM. Weekdays and Saturdays no noise before 8AM and after 8PM except in case of severe emergency conditions approved by the Board of Trustees. Contractors of any kind (landscapers, roofers, etc.) are prohibited on Sundays.

SRPE Illegal Home Rentals

The Board has been informed repeatedly that some homeowners are renting their homes without notifying the Association – perhaps to avoid the \$300 fee, avoid age restrictions, or perhaps just plain unawareness.

This is a violation of our Covenants & Restrictions, which state that the Association must be notified before renting; the Tenant must be aged 55 or older; and a home cannot be rented unless you have lived in it for two years as a primary residence.

It is also a violation of Berkeley Township ordinances requiring the owner/landlord to register with the Township, provide an age-approval letter from the Association, and pay a Certificate of Occupancy (COO) inspection fee, total amount of \$95 (2 separate checks made out to Berkeley Township: one for \$55 and the other for \$40).

Fees from house rentals help keep our dues from increasing and help keep your taxes down.

Most homeowners/landlords follow our C&R and Berkeley Township laws, but there are some who do not.

If you see someone moving into a house in our community, please call the office so we can verify that they have complied with these restrictions. The caller's name is always kept confidential.

PLEASE REPORT ANY CHANGES IN YOUR HOUSEHOLD

To keep information on our community current, please notify the Office if there are any changes in your household.

This is necessary for statistical HOPA purposes.

Typical changes would include:

- o A new or additional phone number
- o A homeowner has deceased or moved from the residence
- A change in occupancy, such as someone moving into or out of the residence
- o Deed changes

ATTENTION Delinquent Homeowners

To bring severely delinquent accounts up to date, and upon the advice of the SRPE Attorney, please note the following:

If you are in arrears 1 year or more in your dues payments, you must call the Administrative Secretary to make arrangements to bring your account up to date.

Failure to do so will result in a Lien being placed on your property. Court costs and attorney fees will be added to the amount in arrears. Ultimately you may face foreclosure proceedings on your home.

As of July 31, a total of \$51,192.12 are due. Out of that total: \$38,953.99 (5 Liens); \$5,400.00 (54 residents unpaid dues); \$4,503.13 (1 unpaid legal fees); and \$2,335.00 (violations not included in liens, and late fees).

Garbage & Recycling Pick-Ups PLEASE Help Keep Our Community Clean!!!

<u>Garbage/Trash</u>, items you wish to dispose of, and <u>Recycling</u> are <u>NOT</u> to be placed outside the front of your home, or on curb side, until after <u>4PM</u> the day before their designated pickup days.

Please keep a lid on it; neighbors should not have to pick up your trash during and after windstorms.

These are Berkeley Township ordinances which SRPE follows.

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

OCEAN RIDE Reserve-A-Ride Program Ocean County Transportation Services Dept.

Seniors (age 60 and over) and/or persons with disabilities (age 18 and over) on an advanced reservation basis primarily to destinations within Ocean County. Pre-registration is NOT required, just call us when you need your appointment.

Hours of Operation:

Monday through Friday Only To make Reservations Call: (732) 736-8989 between the hours of 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

They accept trip reservations on a first-come, first served basis, up to (4) four weeks in advance. Pick-Up and Drop-Off Times: 9:15 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. (Last pick-up)

Trip requests are not accepted via email. All trip requests are to be handled by telephone by calling (732) 736-8989, then press "1" to speak with a Reservationist.

The Reserve-A-Ride program is primarily designed to serve routine medical needs of Ocean County residents. Unlike the Fixed Bus Routes, this service does not operate on the basis of a printed schedule, rather routes and pick-up times are developed each day in response to the service requests we receive. All vehicles are wheelchair lift equipped.

Once your reservation has been made, the driver will arrive anytime within 1 hour to 1½ hours of the scheduled appointment time (depending on your travel distance). In accordance with Ocean Ride's Safety Policy, our **Drivers are not permitted to enter your home**, thus we require that you be at ground level for your scheduled pick up.

Riders will be billed via mail, the month AFTER service. Absolutely NO CASH HANDLING onboard the Reserve-A-Ride vehicles.

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
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Berkeley Township Robo-Cans Automated Trash & Recycling Program

We are pleased to announce delivery of your new trash & recycling cans for the Township's Automated Trash Program. We are asking all residents to start using your new cans once you receive them. Put your old can(s) out to the curb if you want the township to discard.

After Sept 15, 2025, we will begin accepting orders for the purchase of 2nd cans if needed. The cost for an extra can is \$65. Maximum of 2 trash cans and 2 recycling cans per household.

IMPORTANT - PLEASE NOTE: Once you receive the Robo-Cans, keep in mind you CANNOT overflow the cans. You MUST be able to close the lid.

Also, you can NO LONGER leave trash bags on the side of the road. They will not be picked up. All Trash/Recycles MUST be placed in these Robo-Cans.

Loose Branches: Branches are no longer accepted in the trash can or left on the side of the curb. Gather your branches and tie them together with string. You then call the Public Works office at 732-349-4616 to schedule your pickup.

Bulk Pick-up Information: All residents will now have bulk pick up as needed. For all bulk items that do not fit in your can you must now call the Public Works office to schedule your bulk pick up. Upon doing so a staff member will schedule your bulk pick up the day following your next trash pickup. The number to call is 732-349-4616. Do not put bulk out at the curb and expect it to be picked up immediately after you call.

APPROVED BULK ITEMS: Mattresses and Box Springs (must be wrapped), Non-treated Lumber, Furniture, Misc. Household items that do not fit in your trash can.

ITEMS NOT APPROVED FOR PICKUP: Construction Material, Pressure Treated Lumber, Sheds, Fencing, Trash Bags, Masonry Material, Hazardous Waste (please bring to Ocean County Reclamation Center).

As per Town Ordinance stated below, a pile exceeding the size that will fill a 4' by 4' by 8' container will execute the need for a Clean Out Fee. A charge of \$250 will apply.

§ 20-1.12. Cleanout/Moveout Fees. [Ord. No. 08-34-OAB § 1; Ord. No. 2012-11-OAB; amended 3-18-2024 by Ord. No. 24-08-OA]

No person shall place at the curb or anywhere else the contents of a residential dwelling for collection at the time of an entire cleanout of the dwelling unless and until a fee of \$250 is paid to the Township of Berkeley and arrangements are made with the Department of Public Works for such collection. The \$250 fee is limited to a collection that would fill a $4 \times 4 \times 8$ container. Amounts in excess of that limitation will necessitate additional \$250 fee(s) as applicable.

Berkeley Township Robo-Can Frequently Asked Questions

WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS OF MOVING TO AUTOMATED TRASH COLLECTION?

Automation is a faster and a more efficient way to collect residential solid waste. Additionally, other towns that have moved to automated collection have reported an increase in recycling rates and an overall reduction in the amount of trash collected. The hinged lids help to keep rainwater out of the cans, reduce trash weight, and are animal-proof as well. In addition to anticipated time and cost savings, the program will help keep our neighborhoods neat and clean, improve safety on residential streets, and provide safer working conditions for trash collectors. Cans are durable and easy to maneuver.

IS THERE A COST FOR THE NEW CANS?

Your first trash and recycling cans are free. There will be a cost to purchase any additional cans.

WHAT ARE THE SIZES OF THE NEW CANS?

Berkeley Township is offering one (1) sixty-five (65) gallon trash and one (1) sixty-five (65)-gallon recycling can. Residents may request a ninety-five (95) gallon can in advance. Please note a sixty-five (65) gallon can holds 4-5 tall kitchen trash bags and a ninety-five (95) gallon can hold 7-8 tall kitchen trash bags.

CAN I ORDER ADDITIONAL CANS?

For an additional cost you may purchase up to one (1) more trash and or recycling can.

CAN I USE THE CAN I ALREADY HAVE?

No. Only those cans provided by the Township will be collected. Cans other than those provided by the township will not be collected.

WHAT DO I DO WITH MY CAN IF I MOVE?

Trash/Recycling Cans are issued and owned by the Township and must remain at the property address to which they are assigned.

WHAT DO I DO WITH MY OLD TRASH CAN?

You may leave your old can at the curb, and it will be disposed of for you by the Department of Public Works.

ARE THE NEW CANS ANIMAL PROOF?

The new cans are the most animal proof available. If you store your can outside and encounter a problem with animals, you can use a bungee cord to secure the lid to the lift bar, but please remember to remove the bungee cord on your collection day or your can will not be emptied.

WHAT SHOULD I DO WITH OVERFLOW TRASH THAT DOES NOT FIT INTO MY CAN?

Your new trash can accommodate as much volume as 2 to 3 standard-sized trash cans. We expect these cans to be sufficient for your household needs. If you have a one-time overflow of trash, please hold it until your next regular collection day or drop it off at the Ocean County Landfill. If you continue to have an overflow of trash or recycling, a second can should be purchased.

WILL I STILL RECEIVE BULK COLLECTION

Bulk Collection will be scheduled on an as needed basis. If you have items to put out for bulk, you may call the public works office at 732-349-4616 and schedule your bulk pick up.

HOW DO I PREPARE MY TRASH CAN FOR WEEKLY SET-OUT?

All trash must be bagged before being placed in the can. The lid to the can must close tightly. Your cans should be free of any obstacle such as mailboxes, telephone poles, vehicles, and any overhead obstructions. The can's handle and wheels are to face the house. The lids opening is to face the street. No material is to be sticking out of the can. Trash and recycling cans are to be placed at the curb approximately three (3) feet apart from each other, and at least four (4) feet from any other obstacle.

WHAT IF I AM DISABLED?

Our disabled residents must provide a prescription provided by your doctor stating you are disabled and cannot walk your trash and recycling cans to the curb. Once we receive this prescription a team member from public works will bring your can to the curb to be emptied. Prescriptions must be renewed yearly and received by January 31. Extensions may be granted by calling the public works office.

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ARCHITECTURAL CONTROL COMMITTEE Request for Approval

REQUIREMENTS:

The Architectural Control Committee must approve any change to the exterior of the unit such as decks, patios, storage boxes (sheds) or alterations / additions. Any part of a deck (including steps), fence, shed, addition and/or patio cannot extend past the sidelines of the house (i.e., must not be visible from the street).

PLEASE PROVIDE: Plans or sketch, specifications, location on the property.

The owner or contractor must apply for a permit from Berkeley Township if necessary. A letter of approval from the Architectural Control Committee is required for a permit.

Planning to Sell or Rent? Read This First!

If you are a homeowner who is planning to put your home up for sale or rent, or if your home is currently for sale or rent without a realtor, you must contact the SRPE office immediately.

There are procedures, required by the Association and by Berkeley Township, that must be followed before a Closing of a Contract of Sale or Lease can take place.

- Selling: Article 11, Section 4 of our Covenants & Restrictions states, in part, that the owner of the property must notify the Association of the intended sale.
- Renting/Leasing: Article 10, Section(c) of our Covenants & Restrictions states that the owner of the property must notify the Association, in writing, that the prospective tenant meets the qualifications of membership in the Association.
- Berkeley Township requires a "Continued Certificate of Occupancy" (CO). Call the Berkeley Township Code Enforcement Office at (732) 244-7400, ext. 237, for more information.
