Silver Ridge Park East Homeowners Association HOMEOWNERS (HOA) MEETING DATE: April 4, 2024 LOCATION: SRPE Clubhouse, 979 Edgebrook Drive N, Toms River, NJ TIME: 7:00pm – 26 Residents in attendance

- I. Call to Order: President, Phil Cupo, called the meeting to order at 7:15pm.
- **II.** Swearing in of newly elected President, Phil Cupo and Trustees, Kathy Conte, Dave Fuhrman and Lorraine Witkowski.

III. Roll call of Trustees:

Present were Trudy Venkus, Joan Ward via telephone, Pete Sztybel, Susan Swain, James Clarke, Kathy Conte, Lorraine Witkowski, Dave Fuhrman, Mary Conery, and Debbie Moriarty. Absent: Pat Tatulli, Mike Joffe.

- IV. Approval of Meeting Minutes: Minutes of the March 7, 2024 meeting were voted on and approved unanimously.
- V. Approval of the Treasurer's Report: Report given by Dru Sangemino showing an unaudited shortfall of \$8,000 for the fiscal year ending March 31, 2024. The shortfall will be covered by money from savings. Our current Reserve Account balance is \$470,000/50% funded. Treasurer's report approved unanimously.

VI. Board of Trustees Reports

- Administrative Report was given by Mary Conery and included: Real Estate activity – 3 homes closed in March; 12 homes are for sale, 5 "flippers" March Collections of dues and violations \$1,175.00 Real Estate Clerical Position – 4 applicants, 3 interviewed to date
- Berkeley Township Coalition Report was given by Debbie Moriarty ADR training on April 23rd at 11am <u>location changed</u> to Holiday City Berkeley's Library. HR-7084 – "You Earned It, You Keep It" Act introduced in Congress that would remove Social Security earnings from taxable income and raise the FICA tax limit to \$250,000. A petition is available in the vestibule or office to sign for support of the Bill.

"Township Trees" – Berkeley Township no longer removes trees. The homeowner is responsible for all trees on their property including the town easement (first 10 feet from curb) and all other easements that may apply.

Berkeley Town Council Member Mike Signorile is looking to reestablish the Senior Advisory Committee. He is looking for one member from each senior community to meet with him so he can relay concerns to the Town Council. More to come.

VII. Unfinished Business:

A. None

VIII. New Business:

- A. Increase of Capital Contribution to 0.03% of the sale price, minimum \$850
- B. The garden club needs a volunteer with a truck to help move a tree and supplies
- C. Kathryn Forsyth is unable to continue as Recording Secretary. A replacement is needed
- D. New Entertainment Chair needed by September
- E. Inspection of exterior of home prior to sale to correct any violations

F. Proposed rules:

- 1. With the approval of the Architectural Committee, clotheslines may only be installed by the owner of any lot or living unit on the rear of the property within the sight lines of the home. Collapsible umbrella type must be securely mounted in cement. Prefabricated drying apparatus and retractable clotheslines may be used if they are removed/collapsed after use.
- 2. Holiday decorations are allowed for 30 days before and after the holiday. After 30 days, the decorations must be removed.

IX. Motions - all were approved unanimously

- 1. To approve Bello Casa proposal to convert our hall closet to a functional ADA Bathroom for \$33,269.41.
- 2. Payment of \$33,269.41 for ADA Bathroom project is to come from Savings Account and not to exceed \$35,000.
- 3. 

No Knock Registry

Berkeley Township does allow door to door soliciting by permit only. They do, however, offer a "no knock" registry. Form 04-34-OAB Registration Form – "DO NOT KNOCK" can be found on Berkeley Township website: https://www.berkeleytownship.org/search.php?q=no+knock).

Once a resident signs up for this the Town will send a sticker for their front door. A company is provided a list of all addresses on the registry when applying for the permit. If someone does come to their house despite the sticker, they can call the police non-emergency number and report it. The violator is then subject to a fine and possible license revocation. This does not apply to religious, governmental, or political entities. Without the sticker, residents have no recourse other than not answering their door.

The Town cannot enforce the Association's solicitation prohibition.

YARD WASTE

It has been noticed that there are some owners and renters dragging their foliage and yard waste to the **Common Grounds**. Please note that Berkeley Sanitation <u>DOES NOT</u> pickup in these areas, including yard waste left on the curb in the common area.

PLEASE BUNDLE OR BAG YOUR YARD WASTE AND PLACE ON YOUR CURB ON THE REGULAR GARBAGE DAY PICK-UP

Volunteers cannot keep cleaning up these common areas where folks dump their waste. There are too many common areas to keep up.

>> REMINDER << Article 10, Section (u) of SRPE Covenants & Restrictions states:

No work of a noisy or obnoxious nature should be done on Sunday before 10AM and after 6PM. Weekdays and Saturdays no noise before 8AM and after 8PM except in case of severe emergency conditions approved by the Board of Trustees. Contractors of any kind (landscapers, roofers, etc.) are prohibited on Sundays.

Berkeley Township Ordinance 4-27.6 (b1): Non-commercial or non-industrial power tools and landscaping and yard maintenance equipment <u>shall not be operated</u> between the hours of 8PM and 8AM.

BRUSH

Residents can place 4 feet tied bundles of brush at their curb on garbage day. Maximum weight of bundles is 35 pounds. Brush bundled properly will be picked up every week on garbage day.

LEAVES / PINE NEEDLES

Leaves and pine needles are collected April & May and November & December. They are to be placed in plastic bags. They should not be more than 3⁄4 filled, must be left untied at the top and weigh no more than 50 pounds. Bags should be placed on the curb and left there. Check with Berkeley Township Sanitation for actual dates.

Recycling and Trash Cans

Please be courteous to your neighbors, put a lid on your cans,

especially when wind and stormy weather are predicted.

Neighbors should not have to pick up your garbage.

Changes to SRPE's Covenants and Restrictions - Ballot Results

The Board would like to thank all the residents who participated in the vote regarding changes to SRPE's Covenants and Restrictions (C&R's).

We received 167 ballots. One was disqualified due to the lack of name, address, and signature on the first page. That left us with 166 votes to count. The results are as follows:

Question 1 – One year minimum lease	146 Yes	20 No
Question 2 – Two-year residency requirement	134 Yes	29 No
Question 3 - Number of lots owned limited to two	146 Yes	18 No
Question 4 – Allow trusts	152 Yes	10 No
Question 5 – New fence rule	130 Yes	33 No

These changes will go into effect as soon as we file them with the county in the next few weeks. Thank you again, Debbie Moriarty, Trustee

Exterior Inspection of Homes at Time of Sale

It has been noted that there are numerous violations of the architectural rules as they are presented in our governing documents. We cannot inspect every property and issue letters for long standing violations. However, the Board has decided to begin inspections of SRPE homes when they are listed for sale. The Violations Committee, together with the Architectural Committee, will conduct the inspections, which will cover the exterior of the house only.

The purpose is to ensure there are no violations of our architectural guidelines and to protect the parties purchasing the property. We will also supply a letter, on behalf of the purchasing party, to the Township. This letter will confirm that the property is compliant and has met our architectural standards. This allows the Township to move forward with their own inspection, and to issue a Certificate of Occupancy (CO). If the homeowner refuses the Association's inspection of the property, then the Township cannot/will not move forward with their CO inspection. If there is no CO inspection, then the house cannot be sold.

It may sound like we are being tough, but the SRPE Association is a business and is obligated to conduct fair practices for all members. A SRPE member selling their home in non-compliance would be doing a disservice to both the purchaser and to the other homeowners.

Holiday City South has had success with this method, bringing their homes into compliance.

It will take some time, but our eventual goal is to bring all homes into compliance with our governing documents. The Board thinks this a fair and equitable way to begin doing so.

A motion will be made at the May meeting and if approved the policy will go into effect June 1st.

To All Delinquent Homeowners

Although most homeowners pay their dues faithfully on time, there are several delinquent accounts in our park.

In an effort to bring severely delinquent accounts up to date, and upon the advice of the SRPE Attorney, please note the following:

If you are in arrears 1 year or more in your dues payments, you must call the Administrative Secretary to make arrangements to bring your account up to date.

Failure to do so may result in you being sued in court.

If there is a judgment made against you in court, you may be required to pay what you owe in dues, court costs, and attorney's fees. A judgment may also affect your credit rating.

SRPE Illegal Home Rentals

The Board has been informed repeatedly that some homeowners are renting their homes without notifying the Association – perhaps to avoid the \$300 fee, skirt age restrictions, or perhaps just plain ignorance.

This is a violation of our Covenants & Restrictions, which state that the Association must be notified before renting; the Tenant must be age 55 or older; and a home cannot be rented unless you have lived in it for one year as a primary residence.

It is also a violation of Berkeley Township ordinances requiring the owner/landlord to register with the Township, provide an age-approval letter from the Association, and pay a Certificate of Occupancy inspection fee, total amount of \$95 (2 separate checks made out to Berkeley Township: one for \$55 and the other for \$40).

Fees from house rentals help keep our dues from increasing and help keep your taxes down.

Most homeowners/landlords follow our C&R and Berkeley Township laws, but there are some who do not.

If you see someone moving into a house in our community, please call the office so we can verify that they have complied with these restrictions. The caller's name is always kept confidential.

Fire Hazard in your Dryer Vent

All homeowners should be concerned about the fire hazard present in your dryer vent. Aside from accumulation of lint as a fire hazard, the vents also allow access to birds and rodents to build nests or be stuck trying to get lint for their nests. This alone is a fire hazard.

Section 504 of the 2021 International Mechanics Codes states in part that "Dryer exhaust ducts for clothes dryers shall terminate on the outside of the building and shall be equipped with a backdraft damper. Screens shall not be installed at the duct termination." Additionally, cages and booster fans are prohibited.

The recommended backdraft dampers are inexpensive and can be found online or at a local hardware warehouse store. It is worth the investment to protect your home from this fire hazard.



Planning to Sell or Rent? Read This First!

If you are a homeowner who is planning to put your home up for sale or rent, or if your home is currently for sale or rent without a realtor, you must contact the SRPE Clubhouse office immediately.

There are procedures, required by the Association and by Berkeley Township, that must be followed before a Closing of a Contract of Sale or Lease can take place.

- Selling: Article 11, Section 4 of our *Covenants & Restrictions* states, in part, that the owner of the property must notify the Association of the intended sale.
- Renting/Leasing: Article 10, Section(c) of our *Covenants & Restrictions* states that the owner of the property must notify the Association, in writing, that the prospective tenant meets the qualifications of membership in the Association.
- Berkeley Township requires a "Continued Certificate of Occupancy" (CO). Call the Berkeley Township Code Enforcement Office at (732) 244-7400, ext. 237, for more information.
