The Treasurer is an officer of the Board and is responsible for the Association's funds and securities and for keeping full and accurate accounts of all receipts and disbursements in the books belonging to the Association.

An aptitude for Excel, Word and Enumerate accounting software is essential to someone in this position as these tools are used extensively. Responsibilities include, but are not limited to:

- Preparation of a monthly income statement and report of account balances for each account held by the Association for publication in the monthly Association newsletter. Summarize Association Finances and announce at HOA meetings.
- Disbursement of funds for all regular and budgeted expenses as well as any other expense authorized by the Board of Trustees. Requires Purchase orders for any reimbursable expenses approved by a Trustee.
- Arranges for and provides information to the Certified Public Accountant for the yearly review and coordinates a Reserve Study every three to five years.
- Chairs the Finance Committee responsible for creating the yearly budget.
- Files yearly 1099s and reports quarterly payroll information to the accountant and manages users and associated permissions for all individuals requiring access to the Enumerate accounting and property management software.

TIME: 6:30pm – 29 Residents in attendance

- I. Call to Order: President, Phil Cupo, called the meeting to order at 6:30pm.
- **II. Speaker:** Dr. Laura Padham, Audiologist and Certified Dementia Practitioner discussed the importance of correcting hearing loss for optimum mental, emotional, and physical health, as well as prevention of dementia.

III. Roll call of Trustees:

Present: Trudy Venkus, Joan Ward, Pete Sztybel, James Clarke, Kathy Conte, Lorraine Witkowski, Dave Fuhrman, Mary Conery and Debbie Moriarty Absent: Pat Tatulli, Mike Joffe, Susan Swain

- IV. Presidents' Announcements: included the Annual Report, Dumping on Common Grounds, Installation of 1st Trex bench on Stanford Drive, Information available on SRPeast.com, Cleaning up after dogs, Need for a Recording Secretary and Violations Chairperson, and passage of the amendment to the Covenants and Restrictions.
- V. Approval of Meeting Minutes: Minutes of the April 4, 2024, meeting was voted on and approved unanimously.
- VI. Approval of the Treasurer's Report: Report given by Mary Conery for Dru Sangemino. We are showing standard expenses and income for this 1st month of the fiscal year. A change to the March Income Statement due to a posting error, \$1,300 was moved from beautification to Administrative Payroll. The Board has appointed Dru Sangemino, Mary Conery and Kathy Conte as signers for all transactions. The treasurer's report was approved unanimously.

VII. Board of Trustees Reports

 Administrative Report was given by Mary Conery and included: Real Estate Activity – 7 homes closed in March; 8 homes are for sale. March Collections of fines was \$861.76. Unpaid Dues for April \$1,355.00. Liens - 5 recorded liens. Real Estate Clerical Position filled.

B. Berkeley Township Coalition Report was given by Debbie Moriarty.

ADR training was held and there are 5 new mediators.

HR-7084 – "You Earned it, You Keep Act" is stalled in Congress. All are encouraged to sign the petition in the lobby or office or take one around to your neighbors. The petitions are being faxed to Washington.

"Veteran Transportation Program" – Available free to all vets in Ocean County. If interested, contact Debbie Moriarty. Sign up requires your DD214 or Military ID. Uber and Lyft provide the rides.

Senior Isolation Prevention Program – also offering free transportation to seniors over 62. Income limits apply. Contact Debbie for further information. Rides are also provided by Uber and Lyft.

NJDMV Van – will be at Holiday City South on June 26th for Real ID and other transactions. There is a sign up. If interested contact Debbie.

Coalition Website: SCofBT.org has a wealth of information. Residents are encouraged to check it out.

VIII. Unfinished Business:

- **A. ADA Bathroom update:** Construction will begin on Tuesday, May 5th and will take 4 5 weeks. The first payment of \$14,147.77 will be paid that day.
- **B.** Geese We are unable to buy decoys for the clubhouse this year but will consider for budget next year. Suggestions to deter are loud noise, decoys (Swans, Coyotes, Owls), Sonic repellent, spraying with hose.

IX. New Business:

- A. Fire Safety NJ Division of Fire Safety recommends 18 inches between mulch beds and combustible building materials. Mulch fires typically start on a hot day in the afternoons. Also, dryer exhaust ducts must have a backdraft damper.
- **B.** Soliciting Noted an increase in door to door soliciting. Obtain a "No Knock" sticker from the Berkeley Police who can then enforce no soliciting. We will be placing "No Soliciting" signs on our existing signage.

X. Motions:

- 1. To increase the clubhouse rental to \$500 for commercial entities approved unanimously
- 2. Institute an inspection of properties when they are listed for sale to ensure compliance with architectural rules, effective June 1, 2024. Roll call vote: 7 Yes, 2 No *approved by majority*
- To approve a temporary fence on side of house at 8 Sutherland Court; Temporary screen house and black open-rung fence around patio at 1069 Edgebrook Dr. S; 8'x8' shed at 5 Chamberlain Court; widen driveway with pavers at 8 Eve Place; Remove railing, extend step, and replace garage apron at 1084 Edgebrook Dr. S. – approved unanimously
- 4. Approve rules as listed: One opposed passed by majority
 - a. With the approval of the Architectural Committee, clotheslines may only be installed by the owner of any lot or living unit on the rear of the property within the sightlines of the home. Collapsible umbrella type must be securely mounted in cement. Prefabricated drying apparatus and retractable clotheslines may be used only if they are removed/collapsed after use.
 - b. Holiday decorations are allowed for 30 days before and after the holiday. After 30 days, the decorations must be removed.
- 5. Accept the results of the ballot to amend the Covenants and Restrictions approved by residents on 4/20/24.- approved unanimously
- XI. Section Reports: Section 8 reported on a resident who was very pleased with the timely response to a request regarding a tree.

XII. Clubs and Committee Reports of note:

Beautification and Garden Club - Work has started, please join Tuesdays at 9am.

Common Grounds – New company, report any concerns to Mike Joffe.

Entertainment Committee: Hawaiian Luau on June 22nd. Tickets for sale at posted times.

Flea Market/Junk in the Trunk: May 18th with Bake Sale – baked goods contributions appreciated. Spots are still available.

Gray Power- 73.8 hours volunteered in April – processing ballots, weeding, washing clubhouse windows, raking pine needles/cones in common areas, folding plastic for Trex bench.

Park ECHO – Deadline for June issue is May 8th.

Sunshine Club –3 Park Echo's sent to former residents, 1 get well card and 3 bereavement cards were sent. Please call Elva Hall with requests for cards.

- XIII. Public comments: Discussion around putting names in the ECHO of those who have received a sympathy card, proposal to track dog waste to owner, request to make Treasurer's report printed for attendees.
- XIV. Give Aways A \$25 Home Depot gift card, a garden flag donated by the Garden Club, and tickets to several shows at the PNC Arts Center were given away to lucky residents in attendance.



No Knock Registry

Berkeley Township does allow door to door soliciting by permit only. They do, however, offer a "no knock" registry. Form 04-34-OAB Registration Form – "DO NOT KNOCK" can be found on Berkeley Township website: <u>https://www.berkeleytownship.org/search.php?q=no+knock</u>).

Once a resident signs up for this the Town will send a sticker for their front door. A company is provided a list of all addresses on the registry when applying for the permit. If someone does come to their house despite the sticker, they can call the police non-emergency number and report it. The violator is then subject to a fine and possible license revocation. This does not apply to religious, governmental, or political entities. Without the sticker, residents have no recourse other than not answering their door.

The Town cannot enforce the Association's solicitation prohibition.

YARD WASTE

It has been noticed that there are some owners and renters dragging their foliage and yard waste to the **Common Grounds**. Please note that Berkeley Sanitation <u>DOES NOT</u> pickup in these areas, including yard waste left on the curb in the common area.

PLEASE BUNDLE OR BAG YOUR YARD WASTE AND PLACE ON YOUR CURB ON THE REGULAR GARBAGE DAY PICK-UP

Volunteers cannot keep cleaning up these common areas where folks dump their waste. There are too many common areas to keep up.

>> REMINDER << Article 10, Section (u) of SRPE Covenants & Restrictions states:

No work of a noisy or obnoxious nature should be done on Sunday before 10AM and after 6PM. Weekdays and Saturdays no noise before 8AM and after 8PM except in case of severe emergency conditions approved by the Board of Trustees. Contractors of any kind (landscapers, roofers, etc.) are prohibited on Sundays.

Berkeley Township Ordinance 4-27.6 (b1): Non-commercial or non-industrial power tools and landscaping and yard maintenance equipment <u>shall not be operated</u> between the hours of 8PM and 8AM.

STREETLIGHT OUTAGES

Include Pole Number and address of the house nearest to the streetlight.

BRUSH

Residents can place 4 feet tied bundles of brush at their curb on garbage day. Maximum weight of bundles is 35 pounds. Brush bundled properly will be picked up every week on garbage day.

LEAVES / PINE NEEDLES

Leaves and pine needles are collected April & May and November & December. They are to be placed in plastic bags. They should not be more than 3⁄4 filled, must be left untied at the top and weigh no more than 50 pounds. Bags should be placed on the curb and left there. Check with Berkeley Township Sanitation for actual dates.

Recycling and Trash Cans

Please be courteous to your neighbors, put a lid on your cans,

especially when wind and stormy weather are predicted.

Neighbors should not have to pick up your garbage.

Fire Hazard in your Dryer Vent

All homeowners should be concerned about the fire hazard present in your dryer vent. Aside from accumulation of lint as a fire hazard, the vents also allow access to birds and rodents building nests or getting trapped as they collect lint. This alone is a fire hazard.

Town Fire Safety Officials are recommending that community Boards start enforcing Section 504 of the 2021 International Mechanics Codes which states in part that "Dryer exhaust ducts for clothes dryers shall terminate on the outside of the building and shall be equipped with a backdraft damper. Screens shall not be installed at the duct termination." Additionally, cages and booster fans are prohibited.

The recommended backdraft dampers are inexpensive and can be found online or at a local hardware warehouse store. It is worth the investment to protect your home from this fire hazard.

SRPE Illegal Home Rentals

The Board has been informed repeatedly that some homeowners are renting their homes without notifying the Association – perhaps to avoid the \$300 fee, skirt age restrictions, or perhaps just plain ignorance.

This is a violation of our Covenants & Restrictions, which state that the Association must be notified before renting; the Tenant must be age 55 or older; and a home cannot be rented unless you have lived in it for one year as a primary residence.

It is also a violation of Berkeley Township ordinances requiring the owner/landlord to register with the Township, provide an age-approval letter from the Association, and pay a Certificate of Occupancy inspection fee, total amount of \$95 (2 separate checks made out to Berkeley Township: one for \$55 and the other for \$40).

Fees from house rentals help keep our dues from increasing and help keep your taxes down.

Most homeowners/landlords follow our C&R and Berkeley Township laws, but there are some who do not.

If you see someone moving into a house in our community, please call the office so we can verify that they have complied with these restrictions. The caller's name is always kept confidential.

>> NOTICE << To All Delinguent Homeowners

Although most homeowners pay their dues faithfully on time, there are several delinquent accounts in our park.

In an effort to bring severely delinquent accounts up to date, and upon the advice of the SRPE Attorney, please note the following:

If you are in arrears 1 year or more in your dues payments, you must call the Administrative Secretary to make arrangements to bring your account up to date.

Failure to do so may result in your being sued in court.

If there is a judgment made against you in court, you may be required to pay what you owe in dues, court costs, and attorney's fees.

A judgment may also affect your credit rating. Thank you for your cooperation.



Planning to Sell or Rent? Read This First!

If you are a homeowner who is planning to put your home up for sale or rent, or if your home is currently for sale or rent without a realtor, you must contact the SRPE Clubhouse office immediately.

There are procedures, required by the Association and by Berkeley Township, that must be followed before a Closing of a Contract of Sale or Lease can take place.

- Selling: Article 11, Section 4 of our Covenants & Restrictions states, in part, that the owner of the property must notify the Association of the intended sale.
