Fire Pits - What needs a permit and what doesn't?

Because we live in a forested area and to ensure everyone's safety, residents are asked to submit an Architectural Request Form for any fire pit to ensure safe use.

Propane fire pits and chiminea with a screen on the top of the chimney do not require permits.

Any other fire pit, either like the one pictured on top left, or a metal bowl type typically found at Home Depot or Lowes *do require a permit* from the State. These are considered "open burn". Permits are issued by the State Forest Fire Service and we can supply you with the information.

Initial permits are issued for 30 days and, if in compliance, a 90-day permit will then be issued. The permit can be renewed every 90 days. Please provide the office with a copy of your permit.

The size of built fire pit cannot be more than 3 ft. x 3 ft. x 3 ft.

Only seasoned firewood can be burned. No tree branches or other "green wood", no pine needles or any other materials.

The pit must be 15 feet from a structure and be surrounded by 5 feet of clean mineral soil or rock. I hope you find this information useful.

Parking on the Lawn is prohibited - If you see anyone parking on the lawn, please report to the Berkeley Township Code Enforcer at (732) 244-7400 x238.

Automated Call System - If you receive a telephone call from Silver Ridge Park East, please listen to it, or let it go to voicemail and listen later. Please do not ignore it and then call the office to see why we called. The office is overwhelmed with unnecessary voicemail messages, which puts a strain on our voicemail system as well as the office staff to return your call.

In the future we will no longer respond to these voicemail calls. We try not to over-use the system, especially telephone calls and only send messages we feel most residents need to know because we know there are a lot of you that don't have access to email.

We do use the email portion a lot when sending out reminders or a call for help. If you are currently not receiving these messages and would like to, please call the office and we will add your email address to the distribution list. Thank you.

Complaints - All complaints <u>must</u> be in writing and signed by you before they become valid. Forms are on the SRPEast.com website under Forms/Resources, or you can stop at the office to pick up a form. Please do not call the office with any type of complaint.

TREX - We qualified for our 2nd park bench and once received it will be placed in Waldwick Court circle. Thanks to all who contributed to the collection of soft plastics. Due to increased weight restrictions made by Trex (now 1000 lbs.) and the lack of volunteers to help pack, weigh and coordinate the process, we have discontinued the collection.

No Trespassing (N.J.S.A. 2C:18-3) - There have been some instances in our community with people cutting through common areas and between homes and peering in windows. This is trespassing. Some of our residents are fearful. Please take into consideration that there are several residents who live alone and are afraid to confront these trespassers, in fear of retaliation. If you see something or someone that you feel is suspicious, make a phone call to the Berkeley Township PD at 732-341-6600.

Please Do Not Feed the Deer and Canadian Geese - We are inundated with both populations.


No Knock Registry

Berkeley Township does allow door to door soliciting by permit only. They do, however, offer a "no knock" registry. Form 04-34-OAB Registration Form – "DO NOT KNOCK" can be found on Berkeley Township website:

https://www.berkeleytownship.org/search.php?q=no+knock

Once a resident signs up for this the Town will send a sticker for their front door. A company is provided a list of all addresses on the registry when applying for the permit. If someone does come to their house despite the sticker, they can call the police non-emergency number and report it. The violator is then subject to a fine and possible license revocation. This does not apply to religious, governmental, or political entities. Without the sticker, residents have no recourse other than not answering their door.

The Town cannot enforce the Association's solicitation prohibition.

Garbage & Recycling Pick-Ups



PLEASE Help Keep Our Community Clean!!!

<u>Garbage/Trash</u>, items you wish to dispose of, and <u>Recycling</u> are <u>NOT</u> to be placed outside the front of your home, or on curb side, until after 4PM the day before their designated pickup days.

These are Berkeley Township ordinances which SRPE follows.

Handicapped Homeowners Can Get Assistance Getting Garbage Cans To Street

Have your doctor document the handicap, provide their name, address, and telephone and FAX to 732-349-7979. Sanitation workers will bring the garbage from in front of your garage to the truck and return containers to garage.

YARD WASTE

It has been noticed that there are some owners and renters dragging their foliage and yard waste to the **Common Grounds**. Please note that Berkeley Sanitation <u>DOES NOT</u> pickup in these areas, including yard waste left on the curb in the common area.

PLEASE BUNDLE OR BAG YOUR YARD WASTE AND PLACE ON YOUR CURB ON THE REGULAR GARBAGE DAY PICK-UP

Volunteers cannot keep cleaning up these common areas where folks dump their waste. There are too many common areas to keep up.

>> REMINDER << Article 10, Section (u) of SRPE Covenants & Restrictions states:

No work of a noisy or obnoxious nature should be done on Sunday before 10AM and after 6PM. Weekdays and Saturdays no noise before 8AM and after 8PM except in case of severe emergency conditions approved by the Board of Trustees. Contractors of any kind (landscapers, roofers, etc.) are prohibited on Sundays.

Berkeley Township Ordinance 4-27.6 (b1): Non-commercial or non-industrial power tools and landscaping and yard maintenance equipment <u>shall not be operated</u> between the hours of 8PM and 8AM.

STREETLIGHT OUTAGES

Several ways to report outages:

Include Pole Number and address of the house nearest to the streetlight.

BRUSH

Residents can place 4 feet tied bundles of brush at their curb on garbage day. Maximum weight of bundles is 35 pounds. Brush bundled properly will be picked up every week on garbage day.

LEAVES / PINE NEEDLES

Leaves and pine needles are collected April & May and November & December. They are to be placed in plastic bags. They should not be more than 3⁄4 filled, must be left untied at the top and weigh no more than 50 pounds. Bags should be placed on the curb and left there. Check with Berkeley Township Sanitation for actual dates.

Recycling and Trash Cans

Please be courteous to your neighbors, put a lid on your cans,

especially when wind and stormy weather are predicted.

Neighbors should not have to pick up your garbage.

Project Lifesaver

The Ocean County Sheriff's Office participates in an international search and rescue program called Project Lifesaver. The project is designed for "at risk" individuals who are prone to wandering. It is a service to the public to decrease the strain on caregivers of people with Alzheimer's Disease, Autism, and other mental dysfunction disorders.

The Project Lifesaver officers are trained and certified to operate special tracking equipment to locate a client wearing a tracking wristband supplied by the Sheriff's office. The officer meets with the caregiver and client before a critical emergency of search and rescue.

To be eligible for the program the client must:

- ✓ Have a 24-hour caregiver
- ✓ Not drive
- ✓ Not live alone
- ✓ Have a history of wandering

Once eligible, an officer will visit and fit the client with a personal wristband.

SRPE Illegal Home Rentals

The Board has been informed repeatedly that some homeowners are renting their homes without notifying the Association – perhaps to avoid the \$300 fee, skirt age restrictions, or perhaps just plain ignorance.

This is a violation of our Covenants & Restrictions, which state that the Association must be notified before renting; the Tenant must be age 55 or older; and a home cannot be rented unless you have lived in it for one year as a primary residence.

It is also a violation of Berkeley Township ordinances requiring the owner/landlord to register with the Township, provide an age-approval letter from the Association, and pay a Certificate of Occupancy inspection fee, total amount of \$95 (2 separate checks made out to Berkeley Township: one for \$55 and the other for \$40).

Fees from house rentals help keep our dues from increasing and help keep your taxes down.

Most homeowners/landlords follow our C&R and Berkeley Township laws, but there are some who do not.

If you see someone moving into a house in our community, please call the office so we can verify that they have complied with these restrictions. The caller's name is always kept confidential.

They accept trip reservations on a first-come, first served basis, up to (4) four weeks in advance. Pick-Up and Drop-Off Times: 9:15 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. (Last pick-up)

Trip requests are not accepted via email. All trip requests are to be handled by telephone by calling (732) 736-8989, then press "1" to speak with a Reservationist.

The **Reserve-A-Ride program** is primarily designed to serve routine medical needs of Ocean County residents. Unlike the Fixed Bus Routes, this service does not operate on the basis of a printed schedule, rather routes and pick-up times are developed each day in response to the service requests we receive. All vehicles are wheelchair lift equipped.

Once your reservation has been made, the driver will arrive anytime within 1 hour to 1½ hours of the scheduled appointment time (depending on your travel distance). In accordance with Ocean Ride's Safety Policy, our **Drivers are not permitted to enter your home**, thus we require that you be at ground level for your scheduled pick up.

Riders will be billed via mail, the month AFTER service. Absolutely NO CASH HANDLING onboard the Reserve-A-Ride vehicles.



Planning to Sell or Rent? Read This First!

If you are a homeowner who is planning to put your home up for sale or rent, or if your home is currently for sale or rent without a realtor, you must contact the SRPE Clubhouse office immediately.

There are procedures, required by the Association and by Berkeley Township, that must be followed before a Closing of a Contract of Sale or Lease can take place.

- Selling: Article 11, Section 4 of our Covenants & Restrictions states, in part, that the owner of the property must notify the Association of the intended sale.
- Renting/Leasing: Article 10, Section(c) of our Covenants & Restrictions states that the owner of the property must notify the Association, in writing, that the prospective tenant meets the qualifications of membership in the Association.
- Berkeley Township requires a "Continued Certificate of Occupancy" (CO). Call the Berkeley Township Code Enforcement Office at (732) 244-7400, ext. 237, for more information.
